

Biographies



Professor Amy Brown



Professor Amy Brown is based in the Department of Public Health, Policy and Social Sciences at Swansea University in the UK. With a background in psychology, she has spent the last 15 years exploring psychological, cultural and societal influences upon

infant-feeding decisions in the first year. Her research seeks to understand how we can shift our perception of how babies are fed away from an individual mothering issue to a wider public health problem – with societal level solutions. Dr Brown has published more than 100 papers exploring the barriers women face in feeding their baby during the first year.

Dr Kathleen Kendall-Tackett is a health psychologist and International Board Certified Lactation Consultant, and the owner and editor-in-chief of Praeclarus Press, a small press specialising in women's health. Dr Kendall-Tackett is editor-in-chief of two peer-reviewed

journals: Clinical Lactation and Psychological Trauma. She is Fellow of the American Psychological Association in Health and Trauma Psychology, Past President of the APA Division of Trauma Psychology, and a member of the APA's Publications and Communications Board. Dr Kendall-Tackett specialises in women's health research including breastfeeding, depression, trauma and health psychology, and has won many awards for her work including the 2017 President's Award for Outstanding Service to the Field of Trauma Psychology from the American Psychological Association's Division of Trauma Psychology.
