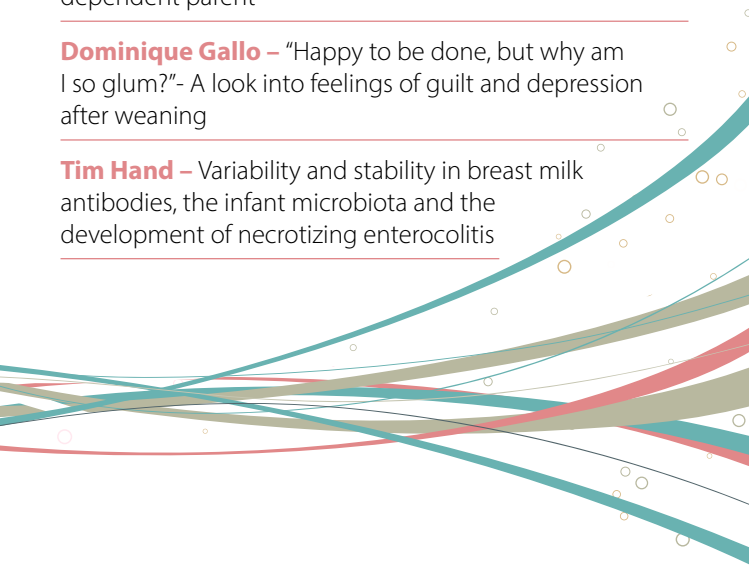

Susanna Scurry RN, RM, MA, IBCLC

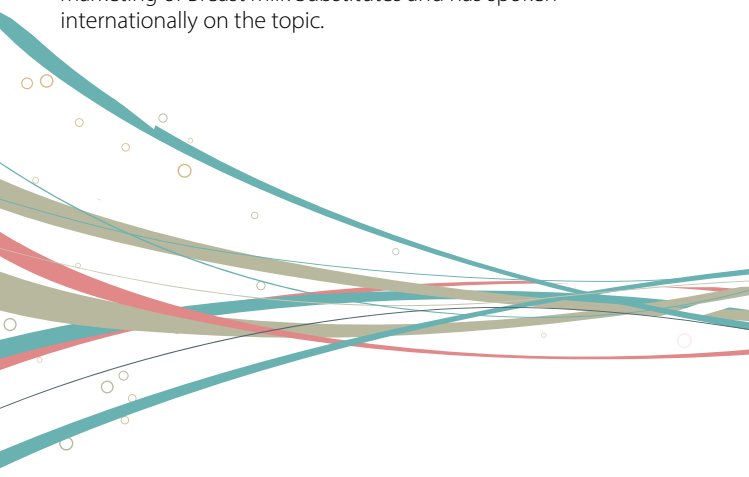
